THE ASSAM BACKWARD CLASSES COMMISSION

Preamble.

Whereas, it is expedient to provide for the constitution of a Commission for "Backward Classes" other than the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes to streamline and rationalize the procedure for inclusion or over inclusion of any class or classes of citizens in the list of Backward Classes including More Other Backward Classes to provide reservation of vacancies in services and posts for the members of socially economically backward sections of the society and for matters connected therewith of Incidental thereto.

It is hereby enacted in the Forty-forth Year of the Republic of India as follows:

CHAPTER I

PRELIMINARY

	1.	(1) This Act may be called the Assam Backward Classes Commission Act, 1993.

Definition 2. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires :-

- (a) 'Backward Classes' means such backward classes of citizens other than the Schedule Caste and the Scheduled Tribes as may be specified by the State Government in this lists;
- (b) 'Commissions' means the Assam Backward Classes Commission constituted under Section 3 ;
- (c) 'Government' means the Government of Assam ;
- (d) 'list' means lists prepared by the Government from time to time for the purposes of making provision for the reservation of appointments or posts in favour of backward classes of citizens which in the opinion of the Government are not adequately represented in the services under the Government and any local or other authority under the contract of the Government;
- (e) 'member' means a member of the Commission and included the Chairperson ;
- (f) 'prescribed' means prescribed by the rules made under this Act ;
- (g) 'notification' means notification published in the office Gazette.

CHAPTER II

THE ASSAM BACKWARD CLASSES COMMISSION

Constitution3. (1) The Government shall, by notification, constitute a body to be known as the Assamof theBackward classes Commission to exercise the powers conferred on, and to perform theCommissionfunctions assigned to it under this Act.

- (2) The Commission shall consist of the following members nominated by the Government ;-
 - (a) A chairperson, who is or has been a Judge of the Supreme Court or a High Court :
 - (b) A Social Scientist;
 - (c) Two persons, who have special knowledge in matters relating to backward classes; and
 - (d) A Member-Secretary, who is or has been an officer of the Government in the rank of a Secretary to the Government of Assam.

4 (1) Every member shall hold office for a term of three years from the date he assumes office.

Conditions of (2) A member may, by writing under his hand addressed to the Government, resign from
Service of the office of the Chairperson or as the case may be, of member at any time.

And members (3) the Government shall remove a person from the office of the member if that person

- (a) Becomes an undischarged insolvent ; or
- (b) Is convicted and sentenced to imprisonment for an offence which, in the opinion of the Government involves moral turpitude ; or

- (c) Becomes of unsound mind and stands so declared by a competent Court ; or
- (d) Refuses to act or becomes, incapable of acting ; or
- (e) Is, without obtaining leave of absence from the Commission absents for three consecutive meetings of the Commission; or
- (f) Has, in the opinion of the Government, so abused the position of Chairperson or member as to render that person's continuance in office detrimental to the interests of backward classes or the public interest.

Provided that no person shall be removed under this clause until that person has given an opportunity of being heard in the matter.

- (4) A vacancy, caused under sub-section 2, or, otherwise shall be filed by fresh nomination.
- (5) The salaries and allowances payable to and other terms and conditions of service of the Chairperson and members shall be such as may be prescribed.

5. (1) officers and other employees of the Commission the Government shall provide the Commission with such officers and employees as may be necessary for the officia! performance of the functions of the Commission.

(2) The salaries and allowances payable to and the other terms and conditions of service of the officers and other employees appointed for the purpose of the Commission shall be such as may be prescribed.

6. Salaries and allowances to be paid out of grants. The salaries and allowances payable to the Chairperson and members and the administrative expenses, including salaries, allowances and pensions payable to the officers and other employees referred to in Section 5, shall be paid out of the grants referred to in seb-section 91) of Section Section 12.

Vacancies 7. etc. no to invalidate proceedings of the Commission No Act or proceeding of the Commission shall be invalid on the ground merely of of the existence of any vacancy or defect in the Constitution of the Commission.

CHAPTER III

FUNCTIONS AND POWERS OF THE COMMISSION

9. (1)	The Commission shall examine requests for inclusion of any class of citizens as a

(2) the advice of the Commission shall ordinarily be binding upon the Government.

10.The Commission shall, while performing its functions under sub-section (1) of SectionPowers9, have all the powers of a civil court trying a suit and in particular, in respect of the
following matters, namely :-CommissionCommission

 (a) Summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person from any part of Assam and examining him or oath;

(b) Requiring the discovery and production of any document;

(c) Receiving evidence on affidavits ;

- (d) Requisitioning any public record or copy thereof from any court or office ;
- (e) Issuing commissions for the examination of witnesses and documents; and
- (f) Any other matter which may be prescribed.

11. (1)The Government may, at any time and shall, at the expiration of ten years from the
coming into force of this Act and every succeeding period of ten years thereafter,
undertake revision of the lists with a view to excluding from such lists those classes
who have ceased to be backward classes or for inclusing in such lists as backward
classes.11. (1)The Government

undertake revision of the lists with a view to excluding from such lists those classeslists by the
Governmentwho have ceased to be backward classes or for inclusing in such lists as backward

(2) the Government shall, while undertaking any revision referred to in sub-section (1) Consult the Commission.

CHAPTER IV

FINANCE, ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT

12. (1) The Government shall, after due appropriation made by Legislative Assembly by law in this behalf pay to the Commission by way of grants such sums of money as the Government may think such sums of money as the Government may think fit for being utilized for the purpose of this Act.

13. (1) The Commission shall maintain proper accounts and other relevant records and prepare
Accounts an annual statements of accounts in such form as may be prescribed by the
Government in consultation with the Accountant General of Assam.

(2) The Accounts of the Commission shall be audited by the Accountant General at such intervals as may be specified by him and any expenditure incurred in connection with such audit shall be payable by the Commission to the Accountant General.

(3) The Accountant General and any person appointed by him in connection with audit of the accounts of the Commission under this Act shall have the same rights and privileges and the authority in connection with such audit as the Accountant General generally has in connection with the audit of Government accounts and, in particular, shall have the right to demand the production of books, accounts, connected vouchers and other documents and papers and to inspect any of the offices of the Commission.

14.The Commission shall prepare, in such form and at such time for each financial year, asAnnualmay be prescribed its annual report, giving a full accounts of its activities during theReportprevious financial year and forward a copy thereof to the Government.

15. Annual report and audit report to be laid before the Assam Assembly. The Government shall cause the annual report together with a memorandum of action taken on the advice tendered by the Commission under Section 9 and the reasons for the non-acceptance, if any, of any such advice, and the audit report to be laid as soon as may be after they are received before Assam Legislative Assembly.,

CHAPTER V

MISCELLANEOUS

16. Chairperson and members & employees of the Commission to be public servant

The Chairperson, member and employees of the Commission shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of Section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

17. (1) Power to make rules.

The Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the provisions of this Act.

- (2) In particular, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters namely :-
 - (a) Salaries, and allowances payable to and the other terms and conditions of service of the Chairperson and members under sub-section (5) of the Section 4 and of officers and other employees under sub-section (2) of Section 5;
 - (b) The form in which the annual statement of accounts shall be maintained under subsection(1) of Section 13;
 - (c) The form in and the time at which the annual report shall be prepared under Section 14;
 - (d) Any other matter which is required to be or amy be prescribed.
- (3) Every rule made under this Act, shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made before the Legislative Assembly, while it is in session, for a total period of thirty days which may be comprised it one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if before the expiry of the session immediately following the session or the successive session aforesaid, the Assembly agree in making any modification in the rule or the Assembly agrees that the rule should not be made, the rule shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be, so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.

18. (1) if any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may by order published the Official Gazette, make provisions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as appear to it to be necessary or expendient, for removing the difficulties difficulty.

(2) Every order made under this section shall, as soon as may be after it is made be laid before the Assam Legislative Assembly.

19. (1)the Assam Backward Classes Commission Ordinance, 1993 Assam Ordinance No. I ofRepeal1993 is hereby repealed.and

Notwithstanding such repeal anything done or any action taken under the said Ordinance, shall be deemed to have been done or taken under the corresponding provisions of this Act.

It is hereby enacted in the Forty-sixth Year of the Republic of India as follows :-

1. (1) This Act may be called the Assam Backward Classes Commission (Amendment) Act, 1995.

2. In the principal Act, in the preamble, for the words "for the members of socially and economically backward sections of the society" occurring after the words "posts" and before the word "and" the words "in favour of any socially and educationally backward classes of citizens" shall be Substituted.

Amendment Of section 2 of Assam Act XVII of 1993 3. In the principal Act, in section 2, after clause (g) the following shall be inserted as clause (h), namely:-

"(h) "process fees" means fees for publication, service of notices or for summoning the witnesses".

Amendment Of section 12 of Assam Act XVII of 1993. 4. In the principal Act, in section 12 after sub-section (2) the following shall be inserted as sub-section (3) thereto, namely :-

"(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-section (2); the Commission may however recover such sum's as process fees as fixed by the Government from time to time while performing its functions under sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act from the parties".

It is hereby enacted in the Sixty-sixth Year of the Republic of India as follows :-

Short title and comm.cement 1. (1) This Act may be called the Assam Backward Classes Commission (Amendment) Act, 2015.

(2) It shall have the like extent as the principal Act.

(3) It shall come into force at once.

Amendment 2. In the principal Act, in section 3, in sub-section (2), for clause (a), the following shall be substituted, namely :-

"(a) a Chairperson, from amongst persons of eminence ability and integrity",

Substitution3. In the principal Act, in section 9, for the existing provision the following shall be
substituted, namely :-

"9(1) The Commission shall, -

- (a) examine requests for inclusion of any class of citizen as a backward class in the lists and hearing complaints of over-inclusion or under-inclusion of any backward class in such lists and tender such advice to the Government as it deems appropriate;
- (b) investigate and monitor all matters relating to the safeguards provided for the backward classes under any law for the time being in force or under any order of the State Government and to evaluate the working of such safeguards;
- (c) enquire into specific complaints with resect to the deprivation of rights and safeguards of the backward classes;
- (d) participate and advice o the planning process of socio-economic development of the backward classes and to evaluate the progress of their development;
- (e) present to the State Government annually its report on the working of the Commission;
- (f) make in such reports recommendation, as to the measures that sould be taken by the State Government for the effective implementation of those safeguards and other measures for the protection, welfare and socio-economic development of the backward classes;
- (g) discharge such other functions in relation to the protection, welfare development and advancement of the backward ciasses as may be referred to it by the State Government.

2. The advice and recommendation of the Commission shall be considered by the Government and the reasons for disagreement, if any, shall be recorded".
